

### Joseph Farrell



The members of the Aqua String Band would like to nominate Mr. Joseph Farrell for induction into the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association Hall of Fame.

Joe's career in Mummery began in 1974 when he joined the Trilby String Band while working at the Pennsylvania Trucking Company. During that time, like so many of us, Joe was bitten by the mum bug and learned to play Drums & Banjo for the band leading up to his first parade in 1975, "A tribute to the American Indian." After 5 years, Joe decided to join some of his fellow band members in saying farewell to Trilby to join another Association band. That is when he found his forever home in the Aqua String Band.

1980's "All for One and One for All" provided Joe with his first parade in Aqua. With this first year under his proverbial harness, his roots were firmly planted. The years following Joe's arrival were prosperous for Aqua including two top 5 performances in the 80's, culminating with his prominent role in 1989's iconic "We Remember." Marching with future Hall of Famers, Joe's desire to be more than just part of the club blossomed into a craving for a leadership role. Being

the guy called upon time and time again to assist whenever needed, Joe worked his way through several leadership roles within Aqua. During his tenure, Joe served on the Theme, By-Law and chairing the Fundraising committees as well as held positions as Drill Master, Club Steward, Board of Director, Vice President and President. Working with team members, Joe's guidance and perseverance, helped Aqua navigate through the ups and downs of the mid 90's while leading with a gentlemanliness and class that has always followed him through his string band career. Through the years, he has exemplified what it is to be a leader and continues to be a role model for newer generations within the Aqua String Band. His enthusiasm and continued leadership were ultimately rewarded with his induction into Aqua String Band's Hall of Fame.

Joe's leadership roles have not been limited to the Aqua String Band. His passion for wanting to help this hobby grow and flourish led him to accepting a Delegate position for Aqua in the String Band Association. While acting as Aqua's voice for 20+ years, Joe sat on multiple committees including the SBA Rules Committee. It was his influence that led to changes in the performance rules in the early 2000's where he was integral in eliminating full disqualification for minor offenses in favor of the current point deduction rule.

His years in Aqua have truly allowed him to embrace the "family tradition" this hobby is known for. Joe introduced his father Tom, brother Tim, and sisters Kathleen and Marie, who have been vital to the behind-the-scenes activities in Aqua, to this rewarding hobby. He currently marches with his brothers-in-law and nephews and raised two sons within the walls of the Aqua String Band. Joe's sense of family goes beyond the immediate. Aqua brought out Joe's empathy for his fellow band member whom he considers his brothers. Always being the first to offer help, Joe has even opened his home for struggling members never turning a blind eye to those who needed help.

Joe's string band journey has had many highs and lows (the loss of friends who became brothers, Warren Smith, Duke Burkhardt and Don McGrogan to name a few) all while forging lifelong friendships, including Aqua's "Tobyhanna Rod & Gun club." Through it all, he has had an unwavering passion that has gone unmatched. Joe has brandished and emboldened the escutcheon of the Aqua String Band for 44 years and will continue to "Play with Passion, Play with Pride" for the rest of his lifetime.

It is for these reasons and many more why the family, directors, and members of the Aqua String Band are proud to nominate Joe Farrell for his well-deserved induction into the Philadelphia String Band Hall of Fame.

### **Jack Mills**



The Fralinger String Band is proud to announce Dr. Jack Mills, one of our Fralinger Man of the Year Award Winners, as the newest inductee into the String Band Hall of Fame. On behalf of all the past and present Fralinger members, we know that our accomplishments as an organization would not have been possible without leaders such as Jack. His unique, intrinsic ability to connect his string band life with his professional achievements, forged relationships, integrated volunteer services, and humanitarian efforts certainly make Jack one of a kind. We are truly honored to see our friend - this selfless, highly-educated man of many talents, known for his dedication, friendship, energy, leadership, and community work - become a member of the esteemed PMSBA Hall of Fame.

When Jack's lifelong, childhood friend Mark Danielewicz was diagnosed with leukemia in the early 1990s, Jack and Bob Mastroianni made trips to the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) to visit Mark. While at CHOP, Jack organized wheelchair races with all the young hospital patients to cheer them up, and he encouraged candy betting. Which landed both Jack and Bob being thrown out of CHOP! Yet, the smiles on the faces of the patients and their joyous, unfiltered laughter truly had a life-changing effect on Jack. An idea was born; so, beginning in the mid-1990s when Jack was a young college student, he orchestrated and coordinated a plan to convince a bunch of his friends (Pat Bradley, Joe Ferry, Matt Kelly, Dan Mizner, Warren Rivell Jr., etc.) from multiple string bands to parade around local children's hospitals during the Christmas season. This time they were not thrown out and were instead, extremely well received.

Over many years, these endeavors grew to include Special Olympics and special needs events, nursing homes, senior citizen centers, Veteran's Hospitals, toy/clothing/book drives, urban area positive interventions, schools, and greeting individuals arriving home from hospitals and rehabilitation centers. The goal of these compassionate welfare missions was not to gain a multitude of positive media press for the string bands - but that was exactly what occurred and what continues to happen to this day. For Jack, string band musicians from Quaker City, Ferko, South Philadelphia, Polish American, Fralinger, etc. coming together to spread holiday cheer is what it is all about. As Jack often quoted from the movie It's a Wonderful Life, "Remember - No Man is a Failure who has Friends". During the last few years, this concept morphed into The Joe Ferry Christmas String Band, which was formed to honor and remember Joe, Kelly Wiseley, and Denny Palandro, Jr., along with candy canes for John Mulholland. Each year, a different charity is selected and friends/family donate to this cause.

Jack Mills has been parading on New Year's Day, consistently and consecutively since 1988. One of his fondest string band memories was even before being in the actual parade itself. In the fall of 1985, Jack assisted his grandfather (Joe Dombroski) in building backpieces and flowerpot hats for Polish American's Dr. Hi Tech Theme which would go on to win first prize. Little Jack's actual Transformer toys were the models used for many of the designs! To date, Jack has been a member of two bands, twice. In both the Fralinger & Polish American String Bands, Jack has served as a New Year's Day Officer. He has been a presentation/drill director, assistant presentation director, co-drill director, assistant captain, theme committee member, band researcher, theme presenter, choreographer, creative/storyboard consultant, banjo player, and Kid's Christmas Party DJ extraordinaire. He has achieved multiple first prizes with both organizations along with sitting on Association Committees. Jack is currently one of the longest-tenured, front-line string band dancers in the parade today. He's also a proponent of health & wellness, in conjunction with competing in Iron Man Triathlons/Ultramarathon Events with Jeff Crompton, of the Avalon String Band.

Moreover, he holds numerous state certifications and highly-qualified teaching credentials in Delaware, New Jersey & Pennsylvania. Jack joined Duffy String Band in 1975 and was recruited by his nephew to join the band, there jack learned how to play the banjo, an instrument he stills play today. While in the band, Jack has made many friendships throughout the years including one special friendship to the Old Man, Henry Kunzig. Jack missed a few parades when he was having his children but never stayed too far from the hobby, always doing whatever he could for the band. Jack has only ever been in Duffy string band and has never had the desire to go to any other band.

Jack has spent many cold nights in our garage building backpieces and props for the parade, though backpieces aren't a staple with string bands like they used to be, Jack still wore one with Duffy string band until this past year at 85 years old. On top of being a mummer and a Father, Jack spent almost 40 years as a firefighter for the city of Philadelphia. Not only is Jack a member of Duffy string band, but he has held multiple positions with Duffy string band such as

Board of Director and theme committee member.

Jack has done many things for other bands to benefit mummery as a whole, he has played with many string bands at mummer's museum concerts to make sure they had enough people and jobs throughout the tri-state area as well as playing with bands on their CD recordings. Jack also participated in the String Band Association All Star CD albums, playing with some of the best musicians the string band association has to offer. In 2016 Jack went up the street two times to make sure the oldest string band, Trilby, could get up the street in their final year and he went back and paraded with Duffy, this just shows the kind of Person Jack Christy is. Jack also has taught a few banjo players that walked through the doors of the Duffy String Band who have gone on to play with some top winning string bands.

Whether it's serving on a committee in Duffy String Band or helping grow the hobby by bringing new people in and teaching them an instrument, Jack has always been a dedicated mummer and always supports the hobby in its entirety. Besides all the work he has done to benefit not only the Duffy string band and the String band association as a whole, but on January 1st, 2024, Jack will be 86 years old still parading and still playing his banjo with the Duffy String Band. ### **Robert Traub**



The Joseph A. Ferko String Band would like to congratulate Mr. Robert Traub on his induction into the Philadelphia Mummers String Band New Year Association, Old Timers Hall of Fame.

Robert Traub, affectionately known as, "Rob," joined the Ferko string band in 1941 as a guitar player. Rob joined along with his brother-in-law, Charles Bittner Sr., when the two followed Rob's nephew Charles "Ace" Bittner Jr. into the Ferko organization.

It was not long before Rob became Music Director of the Ferko String Band, a position he held from 1946 through 1955. During his tenure as music director, Ferko finished first or second prize for 8 consecutive years. This includes 3 first prizes and five second prizes.

During his years as music director, in 1946 Ferko marched in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade in New York, wearing their "Rays and Rainbows" costume and were briefly featured in the classic movie, "Miracle on 34th Street".

Rob was also the music arranger for many years. This includes 1947 for Ferko's 25th Anniversary performance in which the band was awarded first prize. He was also assistant music director in 1959, 1960 and 1961. It was 1961 that Ferko's did their infamous performance of "The Blue and the Grey". At the Show of Shows performance, the band featured the song, "Tenting on the Old Campground." The musical arrangements, including vocals, were written by Rob.

In 1947 under Rob's music direction, Ferko recorded their first record with the Palda record company. This would continue for approximately 10 years and produced many records. Included in this are Ferko classics like Whispering, Babyface, Four Leaf Clover, When You're Smiling, and Hello. In 1955, Ferko recorded their infamous version of Alabama Jubilee. This was arranged by Rob, as many songs were and directed by William "Curly" Conners.

The music for Hello, a signature Ferko song which is still played today was written and arranged by rob while Harry Leary wrote the lyrics. This song was designed as a welcome to the Republican National Convention held in Philadelphia in June of 1948. In May 1948 Ferko was featured on the Billboard magazine cover.

During his many years with the Ferko String Band, Rob made many friends, however, one he considered his best friend was surely our beloved founder, Captain Joseph A. Ferko.

Rob was also a professional artist, owning his own sign and artist business for over 45 years, Traub Sign Company at 13th Street & Girard Avenue in Philadelphia. For many years Rob designed and built Ferko's banner for the lead car for New Year's Day, he also hand painted costumes / capes over the years. Rob's last work was in 1976 when he designed and built the original Ferko plague which was displayed in the Mummers Museum.

Mr. Traub is an innovator of his time and generation. His contributions had a profound impact and influence on string band music in general; he is an integral part of the development of the classic "Ferko Sound." That sound is one which the band strives to emulate today. Mr. Traub did these things through his vision, leadership, talent, direction, his arrangements, and his love of the Ferko String Band. His contributions are truly immeasurable.

Mr. Traub is also a member of the Joseph A. Ferko String Band Hall of Fame.
